THE UNCONQUERED STABILITY OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

[From *De Revelatione* by Rev. Garrigou-Lagrange, O.P.]

In the eighteenth century, *philosophism* in France, England, and Germany attacked the Catholic Faith with all its might. The French Revolution renewed the most atrocious persecutions upon Catholic priests, and intended to found an imitation natural religion. But little by little Catholic worship, works of charity, and religious orders were established, as well as new congregations. The vitality of the Church is manifested in the Vatican Council, in which the infallibility of the Roman Pontiff was defined, and evangelization was extended to Asia, Africa, America, and Oceania.

Thus the Roman Church remains ever the same in its doctrine, government and worship, and notwithstanding the objections of human science, heresies, bad treatment by secular powers and innumerable causes of ruin, which would have destroyed a merely human society. Indeed, it not only remained unconquered, but continues to grow.

Protestantism is a new church, established by the reformers, against the Roman Church, which has an uninterrupted succession of Roman Pontiffs from the time of Saint Peter. The church of the reformers, however, does not enjoy any principle of stability, because, having rejected authority, it is founded in the very principle of free examination, from which follows individualism and perpetual changes in faith, government, and worship.

Protestantism changes its doctrine. Already in the seventeenth century, Bossuet pointed out the innumerable variations in the creeds of the pseudo-reformers, especially regarding the sacraments. Afterwards many rejected the mysteries of the Incarnation, Redemption, and the Trinity. Every day new sects appear, and liberal protestantism has turned into a vague deism, and cannot be called christianity any more. Protestantism cannot resist incredulity, laicism, the spirit of insubordination and license, but accommodates itself more and more to naturalism, which is the same as irreligion.



A NOTE TO NEWCOMERS

WELCOME TO THE TRADITIONAL LATIN MASS, and to the unchanged Catholic Faith. The priests and parishioners of Most Holy Trinity Seminary reject the changes of Vatican II. They want to preserve the Roman Catholic Faith by maintaining everything which was taught and done by the Church prior to Vatican II. In order to receive the sacraments here, it is therefore necessary that you attend exclusively the traditional Latin Mass, and avoid the New Mass, the reformed sacraments, as well as any Masses which are offered in union with the Vatican II hierarchy. DRESS CODE

For men: Jacket and tie on **Sundays** and **holydays of obligation**. No earrings. No shorts. **For ladies:** A dress or skirt is required; no pants or shorts. The skirt must at least cover the knee, and should not be tight or otherwise revealing in any way. Immodest slits are forbidden. **Clothing should be loose and not form-fitting.** A head covering is also required. See-through blouses are forbidden, as well as clothing which is low-cut either in front or in back. **For everyone:** No **tennis shoes, sandals, clogs, thongs**, denim, even on weekdays. No piercings. Clothing with writing on it (e.g., sweatshirts or jackets) is also forbidden. The standards of Catholic modesty must be observed. **Anyone in tight, provocative, or otherwise revealing attire will not be permitted to enter the church.**
